• Adults watch for and reinforce friendly behavior at appropriate times. Snack • Have each child in charge of different snack items (e.g., Joey has juice, Haley has crackers, Sam has orange slices, Ben has cups, Olivia has peanut butter, Cody has napkins). Children have to ask each other for the snack items from a peer.
